RESOLUTION # 200: TO INSTALL ENERGY EFFICIENT LED LIGHTING AT THE LKP COMMINUTY CENTER

WHEREAS, the lighting at the Town's LKP Community Center (LKPCC) is outdated and not energy efficient by today's standards, and

WHEREAS, the cost of replacement blubs and ballast for the present lighting fixtures have increased dramatically and are very difficult to obtain if at all, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to update the lighting at LKPCC for improved lighting and cost efficiencies, and

WHEREAS, the town had a free energy lighting assessment conducted at the LKPCC by Lime Energy which is associated with the National Grid's Small Business Direct Install Program, and

WHEREAS, after conducting the lighting assessment at the LKPCC, an Energy Saving Plan was presented to the Town Board which included replacement of interior lighting fixtures and bulbs at a project cost of \$12,967.67 minus \$8,096.00 in contributions and discounts through National Grid, leaving \$4,871.67 to be paid by the Town of Collins.

NOW LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Collins Town Board hereby approves to have Lime Energy retrofit and install new LED bulbs, ballast and fixtures at the LKPCC, those listed in the Energy Savings Plan, at a Lump Sum cost of \$4,871.67 and that the Town Supervisor be authorized to sign the contract for such.
