<u>Presentation:</u> 2022 Town Financial Audit – Our accounting firm Drescher & Malecki LLP, 2721 Transit Road, Suite 111, Elma, NY completed the audit for year ending December 31, 2022. The audit report was briefly reviewed going over the products of the audit, auditor communications, financial statement update and their observations.

Public Access

- 1. We have not heard anything regarding solar or the windmills.
- 2. A few members of the New York Citizens Audit group addressed the board. This group is organized for the purpose of performing an open-source audit of the New York State Board of Elections. They have been looking into the election process and stated they found millions of discrepancies. The group is not partisan and all are volunteers. No concerns were addressed on the Federal level and the group is asking for a resolution to audit the previous election
- 3. Diane Caruana would like to see a moratorium placed on wind turbines and solar as she feels an un-biased impact study needs to be done.
