Public Access

Chris Jeanniton's property on Main Street got the brunt of the last flash flood as his basement got a lot of water and questioned if this line can be separated from the library line. He asked if the line could have collapsed. The line was traced, and the water comes out 500 feet down the railroad tracks and the Supervisor will show him where. A study was done and the project will be engineered and Mr. Jeanniton will be kept apprised of the progress.

Reports of Department Heads and committees

Code Enforcement handed out their June monthly report.

Highway and Transfer Station report was read by the Supervisor.

Parks department has been mowing and the walking path has been repaired.

Seniors – Scott Martindale asked about opening the senior exercise program at the town park. They would use only the picnic tables, wear masks, social distance, sanitize and take temperatures three days per week – Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Attorney Musacchio stated gyms are still closed and we cannot sponsor the program.

Town Clerk had sales in June of \$5,202.00 with the Town's portion \$5,046.50. Total taxes collected was \$2,359,553.07 and total not paid was \$197,770.31

Water department reported the Seneca Nation is requesting a new water service on Taylor Hollow Road.

<u>Presentation:</u> Proposed Utility Scale Solar Project – Cory McCandless, Project Manager, Omni Navitas Holdings, LLC

Ms. McCandless stated they are working on several projects in Erie County and Ron's property at New Oregon and Lenox Roads is a great fit. The property has great local grid infrastructure. The application was submitted to the Supervisor for both projects, but changes can be made to the application if need to. There will be a 5 megawatts per solar project and the power stays local. They will request a subdivision and NYSERDA is in charge of the project and allows community solar projects (residents can sign up for power). Discussion is being held with Erie County that the pilot payment would be in-lieu of taxes. Usually the Town Board takes lead agency status and jurisdiction usually is up to the town. Numerous entities have to be contacted.

They would like to start in the Spring as it can take National Grid up to two months. Projects like this in the past have been done in approximately one year. They would maintain the property under the panels and all trackers.

Councilman Hotnich asks when the project gets closer to construction would Ms. McCandless come back and explain the process.

The north project is on 35 acres and the south project is on 31 acres.

Board Reports

Councilman McLean spoke with Ron Paluch, Disaster Manager regarding Covid supplies interviewed parks worker, worked on face book and the website and reviewed the vouchers. Councilman Sion reviewed the vouchers.

Councilman Hotnich checked on the Hillview Avenue project, turned over an American Flag and a MIA/POW Flag donated from the VFW and reviewed the vouchers.

Councilman Stelley worked on guidelines and forms for opening up the town hall, interviewed parks worker, updated the website and reviewed the vouchers.

Supervisor Martin expressed concern on sales tax revenue. The second quarter of the year could be down by 15%. Blue Cross Blue Shield is looking for an increase of between 1.9% and 6.4% in premiums.
