BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the current title now be known as Town of Collins Emergency Manager. **RESOLUTION: APPOINT ASSISTANT EMERGENCY MANAGER** WHEREAS, the Town of Collins currently has a position of Assistant Emergency Manager being held by Thomas Ruda, Jr., and WHEREAS, Thomas Ruda Jr., no longer performs that duty. BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Town of Collins Town Board recommends Anthony Paluch be appointed to the position of Assistant Emergency Manager at no salary. RESOLUTION: AUTHORIZE PAYMENT OF MILEAGE FOR TOWN OF COLLINS EMERGENCY MANAGER

WHEREAS, the Town of Collins currently has an unpaid position of Town of Collins Emergency Manager, and

WHEREAS, current COVID-19 emergency conditions require the Town of Collins Emergency Manager to make more than the normal trips for supplies for the Town of Collins.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Town of Collins Town Board recommends reimbursement of mileage costs involved in obtaining emergency supplies for the Town of Collins by the Town of Collins Emergency Manager at the rate set annually by the Town.

RESOLUTION: REQUEST FOR LOCAL FUNDING UNDER THE 2020 CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF AND ECONOMIC SECURITY (CARES) ACT

WHEREAS, the federal government recently enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to address the economic fallout from the coronavirus pandemic in the United States, and

WHEREAS, Section 601 of the CARES Act (P.L. 116-136) provides a \$150 billion fund for states, tribal governments, and units of local government with a population in excess of 500,000 people, and

WHEREAS, less than one-half of 1 percent of municipalities in the entire United States meet this population threshold and are thus ineligible to receive direct funding from the federal government, and

WHEREAS, of the 933 towns in New York, 931 are not eligible for direct federal funding under the CARES Act, including the 3 Cities, 25 Towns and 16 Villages in Erie County; (including the Town of Collins), and

WHEREAS, Towns, Cities and Villages, provide essential services to the over 19 million New York Town, City and Village residents, including, but not limited to, ambulance, police and fire protection services, building and code enforcement, and highway maintenance, and have continued to do so throughout the ongoing health crisis, and

WHEREAS, the coronavirus pandemic has created significant financial stress for local governments in New York as an estimated \$2 billion in sales tax revenue has been lost, as well as other sources of revenue such as permit fees, justice court fines, and mortgage recording tax, and

WHEREAS, the depletion of different revenue sources for local governments, combined with lack of funding, will result in reducing essential services or shifting the cost onto real property taxpayers, many of whom are experiencing their own financial stress.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Collins calls upon Congressional Representatives Brian Higgins and Tom Reed (who came forth to help with the constituency of the 27th District which has no representation), Senator Charles Schumer and Senator Kirsten Gillibrand, to support federal funding related to the coronavirus pandemic that is directly delivered to all municipalities, regardless of population size.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Collins urges the United States Senate and United States House of Representatives to support this Resolution.

WHEREAS, an application dated February 28, 2020 was submitted to the Collins Town Board requesting a Special-Use Permit from the Town Board by Blue Sky Towers III, LLC and Bell Atlantic Mobile Systems LLC to construct and operate a 150' wireless telecommunications tower (plus 4' lighting rod) and associated improvements on land owned by Gary Hammond located near 5492 NYS Route 39 (S.B.L. #332-2-10.11) in the Town of Collins, Erie County, New York (Verizon Wireless' "Morton Corners" site), and
