# Reports of Department Heads and Consultants

Assessor – Supervisor Tessmer presented information of his meeting on the reval.

Attorney Musacchio reported on putting a moratorium in place on solar farms. Mr. Musacchio has a sample of a local law on solar farms for the Supervisor.

CEO – The June/July report was handed out to the Board. A few un-kept properties were discussed and the Town needs to have a policy in place to mow properties with high grass. The Code Officers will make a copy for the Supervisor of anything they send out.

Highway - The new mower has been received; we have hauled gravel; and done equipment repairs. The new truck will come in this week.

Transfer Station – Three open tops, one compacted and one recycled were hauled.

Parks – The basketball court in Collins has been resurfaced; the basketball hoop is broken and will need to be fixed.

Recreation – Movie nights have been popular. There has been a different featured item each week; a few field trips and the ending sleep over.

Town Clerk reported sales of \$5,420.70 with the town's portion \$5,128.22.

## **Board Reports**
