Town Clerk had sales in June of \$ 5,637.36 with the Town's portion \$ 5,397.00. Collection of the 2022 Taxes was turned over to Erie County the end of June. Out of \$2,582,148.62 taxes to be collected; the town collected \$ 2,365,788.81; leaving \$ 216,359.81 unpaid.
